

On May 5, CNN ran on a report on its website that the image of a grand feast enjoyed by nobles may be wrong.

A new study that took a look at the dietary signatures in the bones of more that 2,000 Anglo-Saxons skeletons revealed that most ate a diet of cereals, vegetables and were low in animal protein regardless of their social status.


The study also suggests that these feasts weren't limited to just the nobles, but peasants may have attended as well.

As Europe experiences its worst drought in 500 years, many countries are reporting that submerged relics are now being seen for the first time in years. In northwestern Spain, along the Lima River in Galicia, a roman fort is now visible. Also in Spain the "Spanish Stonehenge" officially known as the Dolmen of Guadalperal is now once again visible. The Tiber River's level in Rome is so low that two piers of Nero's Bridge can be seen near the Vittorio Emanuele bridge that crosses the river near the Vatican. Also foreboding "Hunger Stones" have started to emerge from dry riverbeds in Germany and the Czech Republic. In the Elbe River near Decin in northern Czech Republic one stone reads "If you see me, then weep".
