Medieval Happenings in the Mundane World

Bark Beetle Threat to Medieval Czech Sites

According to a Radio Prague International report on May 20, 2021, a medieval site near Pisek was damaged when trees were cut due to an infestation of the bark beetle. Six burial mounds were severely damaged having been dug to at least half their depth.

Archaeologists have been given to go ahead to conduct a two year excavation of the site by the land's owner, the Municipal Woodland Administration of the city of Pisek. So far ceramics and metal objects like such as knives and buckets have been found.

Burial mounds near the city of Hvožd'any have also been damaged.

People believed that cats could predict the weather. If a cat sneezed rain was coming. Hopefully cats everywhere will predict many sunny days ahead.

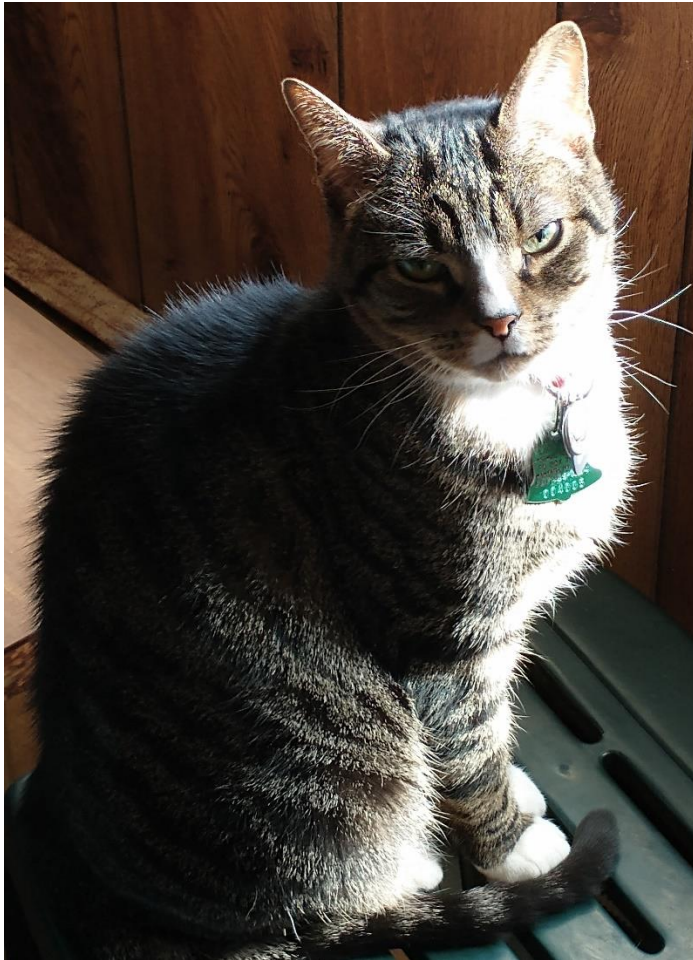
