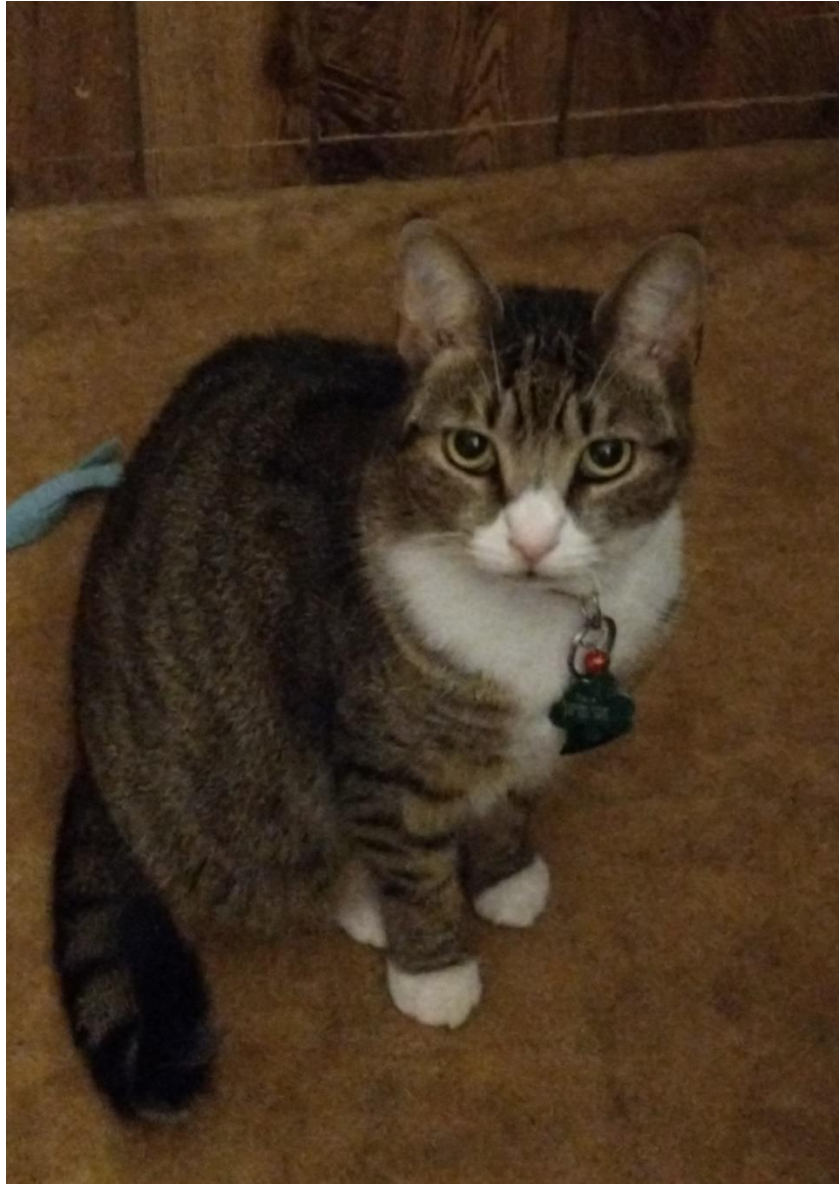
Black Death's Legacy

The CNN website on October 19th reports that scientists examining plague victims from England and Denmark have come to the conclusion that the Black Death has left a lasting mark in human genes. Sadly genes that once gave protection against the plague now leave people more susceptible to auto immune diseases like Crohn's disease.

The DNA studies came from three different groups of skeletal remains unearthed in London and Denmark: Plague victims, those who died before the Black Death and those who died between 10 and 100 years after the plague.
